



DEFINITIVE MAP REVIEW OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY PARISH OF SIDMOUTH

The Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 requires the County Council to keep the Definitive Map of public rights of way under continuous review and to make modifications where it appears that routes should be added, regraded, amended or deleted. A review is currently being undertaken in Sidmouth parish.

Proposal 4: Schedule 14 applications – claimed upgrade of Bridleways 19/21/23, Sidmouth and Bridleway 24, Otterton to Byways Open to All Traffic

Claimed upgrade of recorded bridleways on Mutter's Moor to Byways Open to All Traffic, points P–Q–R–S; T–U

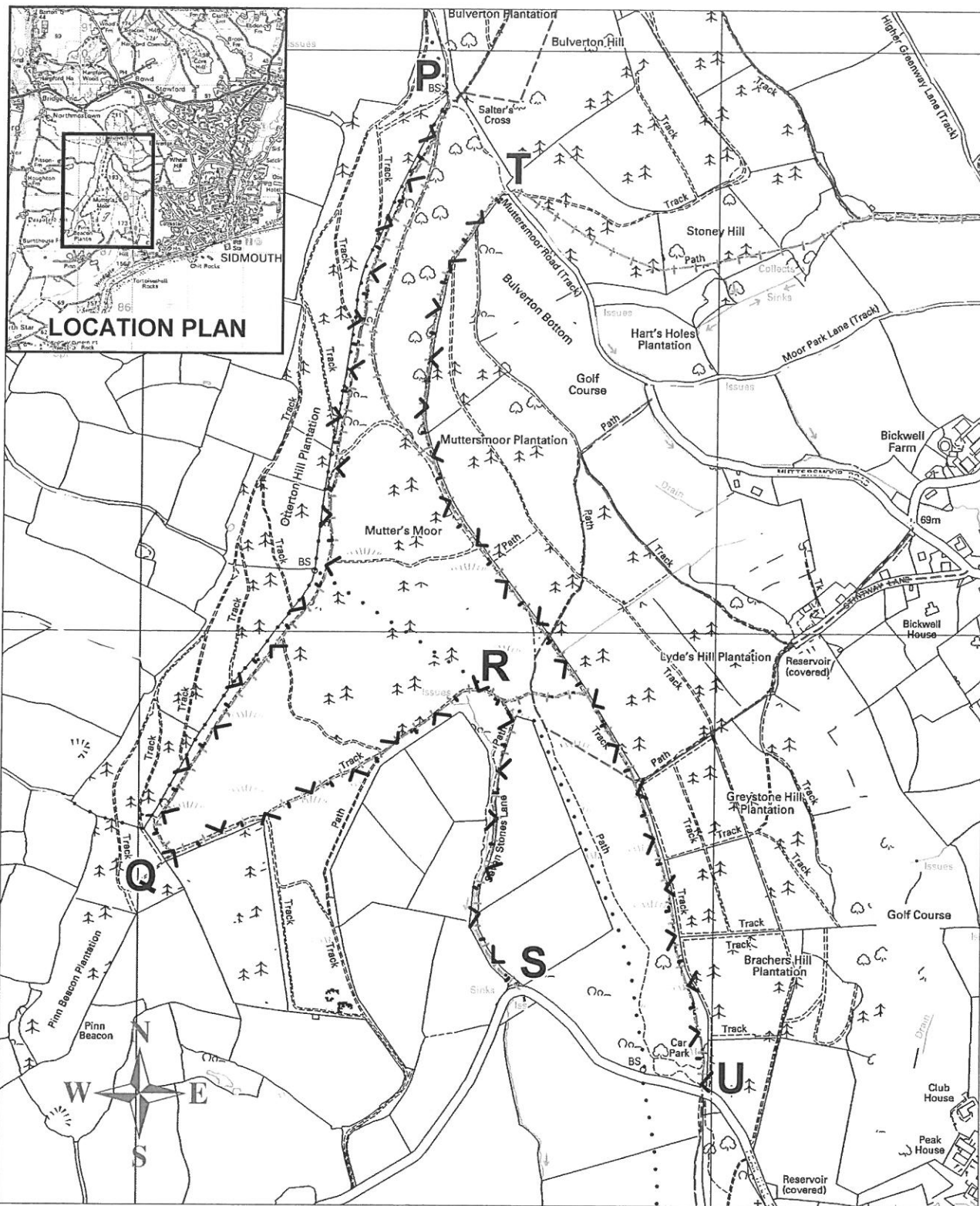
